



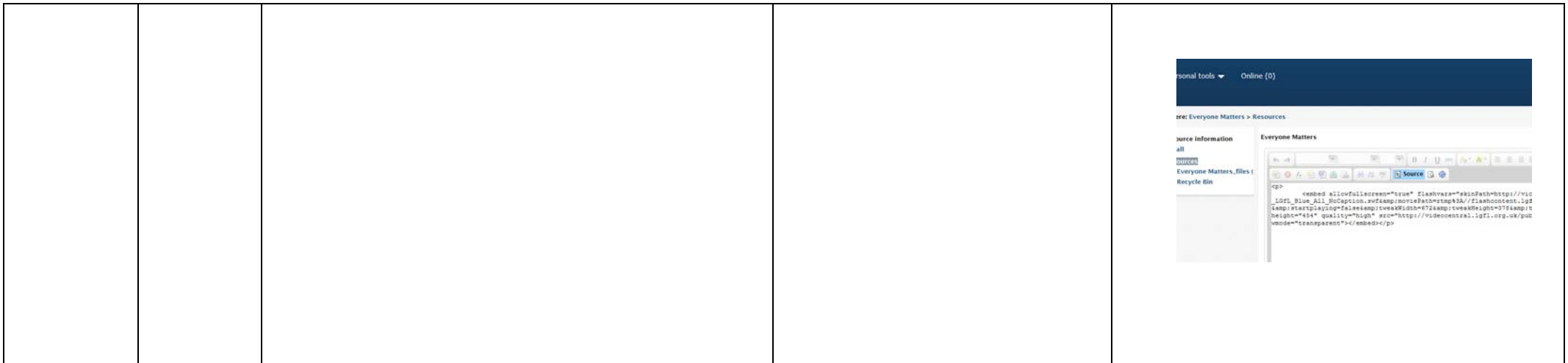

<p>Online discussions using the forum debate tool</p>	<p>Get students in role for their contributions to forums using the 'debate' forum tool</p>	<p>1. Create Forum tool and select 'Debate' forum option</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="radio"/> Discussion Traditional threaded discussion, where replies are grouped under the subject in which they are posted. <input type="radio"/> Conversation A simple one threaded discussion where all contributions are listed in chronological order. <input checked="" type="radio"/> Debate Unthreaded discussion, just like Conversation, but with an option for the user to take a position from a predefined list. <input type="radio"/> Questions and answers Any user can post a contribution/question, but only a selected user or group of users is allowed to reply/answer. <input type="radio"/> Brainstorm All postings are placed as notes onto the page, side by side. 	<p>Teacher can group students into roles / viewpoints or characters and encourage students to participate to online forums from their position</p> <p>Colour coding of viewpoints makes contributions easy to categorise</p> <p>Teacher can filter responses to collate viewpoints</p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create Forum tool and select 'Debate' forum option • Add in different categories of participants to take part in the forum <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px; margin: 10px 0;"> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="radio"/> Police officer <input type="radio"/> Relationship Student 1 (Ryan) <input type="radio"/> Relationship Student 2 (Lee) <input type="radio"/> Student in park </div> <p>Write your contribution to the debate below</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When students contribute they have to select the viewpoint they wish to represent. • Use the 'Filter' section to only see certain views
<p>Embedding videos within the page and placing functionality to promote the exchange of ideas</p>		<p>1. Embed the video code into the learning platform page using the code supplied from the Everyone Matters view window.</p> 	<p>Teacher can draw out particular elements in the video by surrounding the video with questions, forums or votes or tests.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copy the supplied video embed code from the <i>Everyone Matters</i> resource  <p>2. Creating an Assembly room

Create a room to host all the content for assemblies

All staff taking assemblies upload the content used in assemblies to promote further thinking that lasts beyond the actual assembly

Use of the table function to layout page into subsections

Other pages used to host further material to support each assembly topic





Use forum to gather responses from students from the assembly

Promotes further thinking beyond assembly time

Allows further activities linked to assembly themes to be promoted and supported

The role of the LEARNING PLATFORM is very publicly demonstrated by lead teachers / managers in the school

- Manually create an assembly room
- Enrole all staff and students into the room for access. Make sure that the room appears in the room drop down menu for all users.
- Use the '**Table**' function to layout page into subsections

<p>Using sound recorder to interview students for literacy</p>	<p>Recording is quick and simple and allows teachers to collect work as audio via the hand in folders</p> <p>All audio tracks and assessment of them can be viewed in the ePortfolio function</p>		<p>Very simple recording process</p> <p>Instantly available to users in a room</p> <p>Allows teachers to offer a range of media that students can express themselves in – whilst still staying within the framework of the LEARNING PLATFORM</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create 'Hand in' folder • Create 'Sound recorder' object  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make your recording and save when you are happy with it • The sound object can now be played via the hand in folder for the teacher or the 'ePortfolio' function
<p>Using Test function to challenge students</p>	<p>Efficiently monitor and manage the collection of test results</p> <p>Give fast feedback to students about their work</p> <p>Use the streamlined test function to promote challenge in learning</p>	<p>1. Use 'Test' function to challenge for students understanding*</p>  <p>2. Use the self assessment function for students to justify their answer</p> <p>3. The eportfolio function to monitor students contributions</p>  <p><i>*The screenshots provided do not relate to the Everyone Matters resource</i></p>	<p>Challenge students with tests where all the answers are correct – but some are weighted more than others</p> <p>Students will have to consider carefully their answers and justify their responses. The teacher gets to record all the responses in the eportfolio</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a 'Test' – using answers that could all be deemed correct – except that some represent better understanding of the issues learnt. It is worth spending time making sure the question have rigour. • Require students to complete the self assessment submission for each answer – to justify their answers
